Opportunities for training in Aboriginal health research

Who can apply?

Researchers enrolled in a master's or doctoral program with any university, whose thesis proposal on Aboriginal health has been approved by an academic committee

Other requirements

- priority will be given to Aboriginal students
- an Aboriginal partnership is required for non-Aboriginal students
- preference to Aboriginal health subjects of national relevance
- completed application according to CIHR guidelines

Deadline

Applications will be processed as received

How to apply

The application is submitted to the Ottawa ACADRE, *not* directly to CIHR. Applications are available on the CIHR website.

A completed application consists of:

- a one page summary of the proposed dissertation
- the CIHR CV module
- the CIHR training module
- sponsors' reports
- official transcripts
